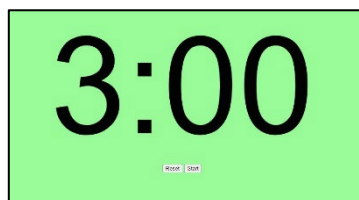

The Department of Airports worked successfully with Wings Over Camarillo (WOC) leadership to successfully develop an excellent balance of air show acts that were embraced by event guests, the local neighbors, and the Ventura County Animal Shelter.

Bill Thomas and Bob Trimborn from Wings Over Camarillo reviewed a PowerPoint presentation summarizing the event, highlighting its scale and the significant planning and resources involved to provide the CAA/OAA and the public with a better understanding of what it takes to successfully host the event. The Authorities commented on the outstanding work of the Wings Over Camarillo team and volunteers.

Supervisor Vianey Lopez thanked Vice Chair Barbara Filkins, who played a key role in organizing the event, for her dedication and for recognizing the importance of investing in youth and supporting the future of those entering the aviation field. Councilmember Bert Perello and Chair Tony Trembley expressed their gratitude for the Aviation Career Day involvement and its outreach efforts with the students.

Director Freitas provided an overview of the airport's history and explained how the Commission and the Authorities were established. Director Freitas reviewed the research conducted on the cost and time associated with each meeting and provided a summary of the previous night's Aviation Advisory Commission meeting where this agenda item was presented. Questions and comments from the Authorities and public were heard and addressed.

Councilmember Bert Perello read a statement from the City of Oxnard. Ms. Powers heard and addressed the statement.

Action: Upon the motion of Supervisor Vianey Lopez and seconded by Councilmember Bert Perello, the Authority hereby approves the recommendations as stated in the respective agenda letter, and adding an additional recommendation for the Department of Airports to follow-up with the City of Oxnard with respect to the comments shared by Councilmember Bert Perello, for item 6.D. Erin Powers, Deputy Director, presented the item to the Camarillo Airport Authority, providing an overview of the study's timeline and recommending that the Board of Supervisors approve the noise study and authorize the Director of Airports, or designee, to make any minor modifications requested by the FAA and that the study be categorically exempt from California Environmental Quality Act. Ms. Powers addressed a question from Vice Chair Scott Barer regarding the meaning of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). Chair Tony Trembley commended Airport staff, noting that it has been a long and challenging process for the Department of Airports. He highlighted the exemplary work carried out and praised staff for their community outreach and transparency efforts.

Action: Upon the motion of Supervisor Jeff Gorell and seconded by Vice Chair Scott Barer, the Authority hereby approves the recommendations as stated in the respective agenda letter for item 6.E. All members voted and the motion passed unanimously 4-0.

F. Subject: Review, Discuss and Recommend Modifications to Draft Language, Project Scope and Process Associated with the Request for Proposal to Improve Approximately 4.13-Acres of Land at Camarillo Airport; This Property Currently is Occupied by Forty-Nine (49) Small and Medium Size Aircraft Hangars

Recommendation:

Staff requests that the Camarillo Airport Authority review, discuss and recommend language that may be utilized by the Department of Airports for the upcoming Request for Proposals (RFP) to improve approximately 4.13-acres of land at Camarillo Airport. This property is occupied by forty-nine (49) small and medium-sized aircraft hangars. (Exhibit 1).

Keith Freitas, Director of Airports, presented the item to the Camarillo Airport Authority, with a PowerPoint slideshow of an overview of the 49 hangars, noting that many are in disrepair and that 15 are in such poor condition they cannot currently be rented. He explained that the next step involves refining the RFP language and requested input from the Authority on what they would like included in the RFP. It's about using language that keeps all options open, allowing us to fully evaluate our opportunities and make the best decision as it moves through the system. Public comments were received by staff and the Authority. Questions and comments from the Authority were heard and addressed.

Action: Upon the motion of Vice Chair Scott Barer and seconded by Supervisor Jeff

Gorell, the Authority hereby approves the recommendations as stated in the respective agenda letter, and adding an additional recommendation for the Department of Airports to modify the proposed language making it clear that there are options, for item 6.F. All members voted and the motion passed unanimously 4-0.

7. DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Director Keith Freitas opened the Director's Report with an update on Heart Aerospace, a Swedish-based company that recently relocated its headquarters to Irvine, California. He noted that the company's team required a test area and has been utilizing ramp space at Oxnard Airport. A video was presented showcasing one of Heart Aerospace's electric engines, and it was clarified that the noise heard in the footage was generated by the generator, not the engine itself.

The Department of Airports, in collaboration with the County CEO's Administrative Economic Vitality Group, delivered a brief opening at the Fathomwerx Annual Summit held in Port Hueneme. Staff announced the launch of the County's Innovation Center and provided an overview of Area 805 Advanced Air Mobility. Director Freitas commented that it was a great event and that there were many networking opportunities. The event, hosted by the Navy, featured approximately 70 exhibitors across air, sea, and below sea. It was an exciting opportunity and a valuable platform to share information regarding advanced air mobility.

Director Freitas shared upcoming deadlines and provided an update on the application process to select a new Camarillo/Oxnard Airport Authority public member and alternate public member. He noted that current public members will serve through February 28, 2026, with the next public member cycle beginning in March 2026.

The former CloudNine facility on the corner of Las Posas now displays new signage from its new owners, Sky Harbour.

Discussion:

The original development planned by APL was included in a 1999 Airport Master Plan and a Program Environmental Impact Report (EIR). A Program EIR requires that the County evaluate subsequent improvement plans to determine whether they are in keeping with the original plan and projected environmental effects, or whether additional

environmental analysis will be necessary. However, a Program EIR also allows for the actual design and location of various improvements to be modified because of changing conditions at the Airport.

In this case, APL's site plan has largely remained the same, focused on developing hangars for aircraft storage. A subsequent lease amendment allows the remaining development area to include both aircraft storage hangars and/or hangars/facilities to support limited Aeronautical Service Provider (aka Fixed Base Operator) services. Therefore, APL has adjusted the quantity and size of hangars in the site plan to meet the potential demands of limited Aeronautical Service Providers (ASP) and has included a freestanding restroom and an aviation support building with parking. This is consistent with the 1999 Program EIR, which did not specify whether the hangars would be for storage or other commercial purposes, and even provided a discussion of the types of uses that are typical for general aviation hangars, explicitly contemplating "housing fixed base operator activities". Additionally, the long-term forecasts anticipated annual operations of 305,800 takeoffs and landings and the environmental effects associated with those operations. Current annual operations average approximately 188,000 and are well within the operational levels and activities contemplated in the 1999 Program EIR.

Finally, California Code of Regulations, Title 14, §15332, allows for a Categorical Exclusion for in-fill development projects. APL's proposed site plan meets the conditions of this exemption as the project is consistent with general plan policies and zoning regulations; the proposed development occurs within city limits and is less than five acres and surrounded by urban uses; the project site has no value as habitat for endangered, rare or threatened species; the project would not result in any significant effects to traffic, noise, air quality, or water quality; and the site can adequately be served by all required utilities and public services.

Therefore, the Airport, as lead agency, requests the Board find the project categorically exempt from CEQA under CEQA Guidelines section 15332 (In-fill Development Projects) because it meets the conditions as described above and there is no possibility that the project will have a significant effect on the environment, either individually or cumulatively. A Notice of Exemption will be filed after the Board's action.

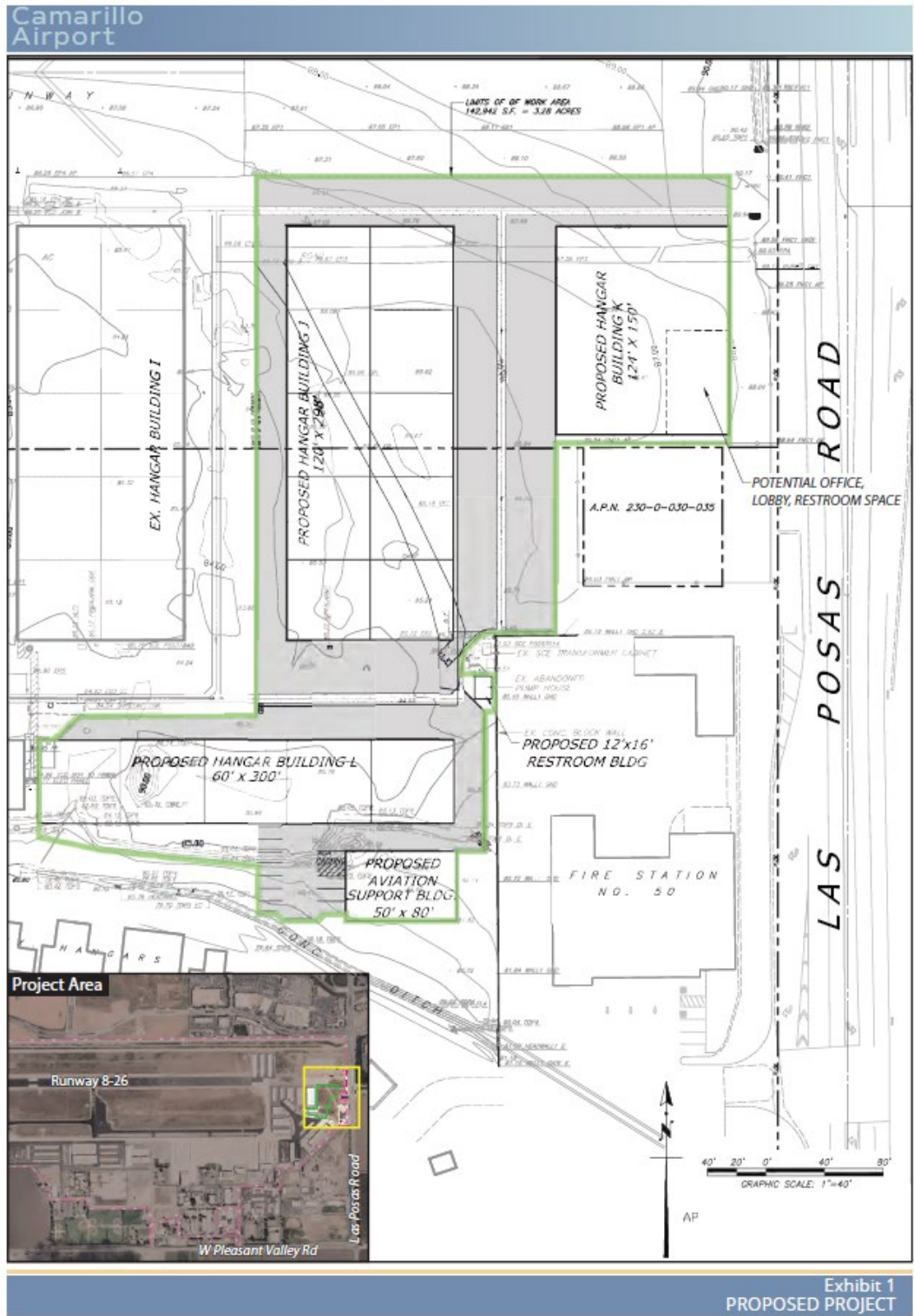

Approve, and authorize the Director of Airports or his designee to sign, the proposed Second Amendment to Lease with Camino Ruiz, LLC., at the Camarillo Airport (Exhibit 1).

Fiscal Impact: There are no fiscal impacts associated with the recommended action.

Discussion:

In July 2013, the Kim and Bill Burr Family Trust signed a lease with the County for the development of a 9,550 square foot hangar facility which shares a private ramp and gate with three other hangars developed by Bill Burr (which hangars are currently leased by other tenants). In March 2022, the lease was amended (the "First Amendment") to remove the right to operate a Part 135 Charter service at the premises and allow for the use of the hangar for aircraft repair and maintenance, in addition to aircraft storage. Thereafter the lease was assigned to Camino Ruiz, LLC.

Camino Ruiz, LLC., now wishes to restore the ability to operate a Part 135 Charter Service at the premises and County agrees to amend the lease to implement this modification of services to include Charter service in addition to aircraft repair and maintenance and aircraft storage. The Department of Airports supports this additional service at the premises.

Strategic Priority:

Fiscal Responsibility and Economic Vitality

By expanding the allowable services at this Limited Service Aviation Service Provider, the existing facility is able to offer additional aviation services at the Camarillo Airport, thereby expanding customer services available to aviation users, and supports the regional economy with increased tax revenues and employment opportunities. The Department of Airports also increases its self-sustaining position in the County, and local business benefits from additional visits by patrons and users.

THIS SECOND AMENDMENT ("Second Amendment") is made and entered into by and between COUNTY OF VENTURA ("County"), and CAMINO RUIZ, LLC, a California limited liability company, successor-in-interest to WILLIAM C.B. BURR AND KIM ALLISON BURR AS TRUSTEES OF THE KIM AND BILL BURR FAMILY TRUST DATED DECEMBER 17, 2004 ("Tenant") effective as of the date of the last signature to this agreement (the "Effective Date").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, County and Tenant entered into a lease dated July 16, 2013, ("the Original Lease"), and a First Amendment dated May 24, 2022 for certain property at Camarillo Airport, commonly known as 65C Durley, and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to amend the Original Lease to modify the Purpose and Required Uses as outlined in Paragraph 4 of the Original Lease and First Amendment, and

WHEREAS, the Original Lease, First Amendment, and this Second Amendment shall hereinafter be referred to as the "Lease,"

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises herein contained and good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged by the parties, County and Tenant agree as follows:

1. **AMENDMENT CONTROLLING; DEFINITIONS.** County and Tenant hereby acknowledge and reaffirm all of their respective rights, duties and obligations under the Lease including this Second Amendment. All terms of the Original Lease and the First Amendment remain in full force and effect except as expressly modified by this Second Amendment. Should anything in this Second Amendment conflict with anything in the Original Lease and First Amendment, the terms of this Second Amendment shall control. Unless otherwise specifically set forth herein, all capitalized terms herein shall have the same meaning as set forth in the Original Lease.
2. **In the First Amendment, Paragraph 4. Purpose,** the sentence "Tenant shall operate and maintain a first-rate aircraft repair, maintenance service, and may operate a storage service" shall be followed with "and Tenant may operate a Part 135 Charter Service"
3. **In the First Amendment, Paragraph 4. Purpose. A. Required Services,** the first sentence "Tenant is hereby granted the nonexclusive privilege to engage in, and Tenant agrees it may engage in, the business of providing aircraft storage and repair as a limited Aeronautical Service Provider (ASP), as further defined in

the Airport Minimum Standards.” shall be modified by inserting “and/or a Part 135 Charter Service” before “as further defined...”

The second sentence shall be modified by inserting “and Part 135 Charter Service”, following “Tenant is engaged in the business of providing aircraft repair services...”

4. **ENTIRE AGREEMENT.** This Second Amendment, together with the Original Lease, and First Amendment, contains the entire Agreement between County and Tenant with respect to the matters stated herein and both parties acknowledge that neither relies upon any statements or representations by the other not contained herein.
5. **MODIFICATION.** This Second Amendment cannot be modified orally but only in writing signed by both parties hereto.

Along with a life-long love of aviation, Bates participants gained a keen sense of community (family) and self-confidence that we, as individuals and leaders, can help shape the future.

Teaching and education are my major focus. I am actively flight instructing and continue to realize how much I enjoy teaching. Last December, I celebrated my five-year anniversary as a faculty member at

California Aeronautical University. I am active in the ASTM¹ committees on General Aviation and Light Sport Aircraft certification/design and am researching the impacts of automation on human elements of flight for my doctorate.

Giving Back:

Flight is a privilege and a passion. During these past two years, I have continued to try to give back in as many areas as I can. I continue to advocate for aviation, both for the career opportunities it offers as well as its impact on making better engineers, scientists, and leaders. I support requests from educators to introduce the airport and what it can offer to students. I regularly fly EAA Young Eagles at both County airports. I have been active since 2025 as part of the management team for the STEM pavilion at the Wings Over Camarillo Air Show.

This year (2025), I led the annual Aviation Career Day at Camarillo Airport. This event, sponsored by the Ventura County Ninety-Nines, saw record attendance – over 1,000 attendees, middle and high school students, from across Ventura County. Besides setting record attendance, this year was key for attendees from the more remote locations such as east County.

I participated as a PAC member in the Oxnard Airport Noise Study. As an FAA FAAST representative, I continue to support the Department of Airports with issues around safety and noise at Oxnard. I am part of the technical advisory team, including both aviation professionals and community members, for the airspace redesign study at Camarillo.

Since 2019, I have flown as a volunteer pilot for LightHawk, an organization that depends on volunteer pilots and their airplanes to support conservation efforts. My recent missions involve animal telemetry – monitoring the Channel Island foxes and tracking California condors.

Please briefly explain why you wish to serve on the Airport Authority:

I have three basic reasons for applying, reasons that are in line with my background and my perspective:

- **Commitment:** I have a deep commitment to the ideals which Iris and the Bates Program instilled in me. I personally have seen how aviation has shaped individuals in leadership roles – not just individuals directly employed in the aviation/aerospace field. As a result, I am committed to making sure that future opportunities are there for those that come behind me.
- **Community:** The concept of community is what you make of it, but (as I have experienced) it can be powerful. A sense of community can bring people, even with dissimilar perspectives, together and can make things happen for the greater good. For Oxnard Airport to prosper (not just exist), a sense of community must cross the airport boundary fence, the challenge being to achieve a balanced perspective from all sides. As public member, I would strive to help achieve this balance.
- **Opportunity:** Commitment and community are empty concepts without action. Over the past years, I have endeavored to put both concepts into action – bringing together the Ventura County aviation community, supporting EAA Young Eagles and Eagles programs at both County airports, supporting

I pursued these disciplines with the goal of developing a strong ethical and moral framework so that I could go on to work in public service, as I have done in various capacities both professionally and as a volunteer for my entire life. Where Air Travel is the Problem, Airports are the Solution

Harnessing Regional Airports As Centers for Climate Resilience

OVERVIEW

Modern consensus in the scientific community holds that climate change is a complicated issue involving numerous manmade and natural causes. Air travel has been well established as a manmade causative agent, with around 2.5% of CO₂ emissions being accounted for by aviation. Additionally, other non-CO₂ warming-related changes have been observed due to all aviation emissions and externalities in twice the amount as CO₂, making air travel a formidable threat to the planet. In fact, of all types of travel, flying causes the most damage.

And the problem air travel causes is only projected to worsen. Airlines have made significant steps in addressing emissions in recent years, though exponential growth amongst raw number of travelers in the air at any given time has outpaced emissions progress by around 6-to-1.

As with the issue of global climate change over all, it is therefore reasonable at this stage to suggest policymakers and public organizations turn to resiliency strategies, given the ongoing polarization of the subject, and the clear and certain refusal to prioritize climate impacts over convenience. And the good news for regional governments is that where air travel is the problem, airports are the solution.

This Policy Brief examines strategies regional airports may take to both improve their own internal climate resilience, while offering broader climate change action to the surrounding communities.

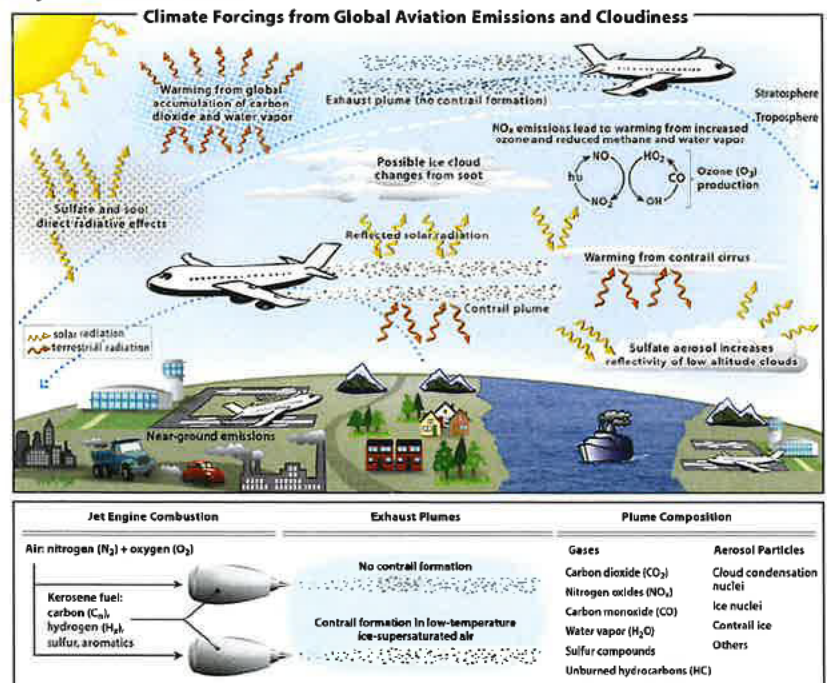

STRATEGIES FOR CLIMATE RESILIENCE

HARDENED INFRASTRUCTURE

Regional airports are especially poised to implement climate hardening strategies, due to the limited cost of implementation at smaller airports. Such strategies include: converting ground equipment to electric or hybrid energy sourcing, rainwater collection and recycling, installation of solar for energy generation, and development of facilities and buildings on the property with smart technology in mind.

CARBON OFFSETTING

An emerging trend in airports and other ports of travel and global exchange (e.g. ports, transit center, etc.) is the implementation of certified carbon offsetting technology. These types of technologies convert, capture, or remove unavoidable fossil fuel emissions through various technologies and equipment designed to offset the carbon output of regional economic activity.

OPERATIONS EFFICIENCY

Airports and airlines should prioritize operational efficiency to develop climate resilience. This would include optimizing flight planning, which is especially critical for private air travel, and encouraging the use of SAFs, which blended with traditional fuel reduces emissions and preserves the life of the craft.

Climate resilience in an ever-changing landscape is not a one-time solution. Airports must dedicate time and resources to expand their knowledge base to understand and implement climate resilience strategies over time, and seek Airport Carbon Accreditation. One defining characteristic of global climate change is its unpredictability. Airports must therefore be malleable to new and emerging science, and appropriate funding as a part of regular operations accordingly.

Harnessing Regional Airports As Centers for Climate Resilience

In addition to becoming internally fortified against climate change for sustainability of operations, staffing, and long term revenue generation or economic output, regional airports have a unique opportunity to offer themselves as centers for climate resilience for the surrounding communities.

Regional airports often have sizable acreage of available land that is unused by runway tarmac and airport infrastructure, and therefore available for emergency operations in the event of a catastrophic climate-related event. Regional airports could also offer regions long-term water tanks and storage for wildfire response, as well as housing for emergency vehicles for rapid response to wildfire or flooding. Additionally, regional airports may develop planning and infrastructure to rapidly open shelter for humans and/or animals in the event of evacuations during a disaster scenario.

Regional airports are in the unique position, due to their accessibility to surrounding businesses and residents, to offer more sustainable transportation options for the community. For example, airports may install electric vehicle charging stations, available for public use. They may also work with area transit to ensure ample accessibility of public transit through the airport. Lastly, regional airports may develop "park-and-ride"-style parking structures available for public use - irrespective of whether the public is flying to or from the facility - to encourage regional carpooling.

When private businesses lease office spaces, hangars, and other facilities at regional airports, discounts and credits for implementing sustainability practices offer an economic incentive for other organizations to become partners in climate resilience and long term sustainability. Numerous studies have shown these types of credits improve economic activity in the region overall, while harnessing meaningful and long term investment in climate resilience.



By aligning aviation expertise with community representation, I work to ensure the airport remains a safe, efficient, and good neighbor for everyone it serves.

Discussion:

Consistent with the 1976 Joint Powers Agreement between the County of Ventura and the City of Camarillo, Article IV of the Camarillo Airport Authority's Bylaws states in part, "The Authority shall be composed of two members of the Board, which members shall be selected by the Board; two members of the Council, which members shall be selected by the Council; and a fifth member (Public Member) to be selected by a majority of the other four members."

Article IV of the Bylaws further states, "Alternates for the members from the Board and the Council may be selected by the respective bodies, from the respective bodies. An alternate to the Public Member may be selected by a majority vote of the other four Authority members."

At the January 11, 2024 meeting, Scott Barer was selected as the Public Member and William Thomas was selected as the Alternate Public Member. Per the Bylaws, no Public Member or Alternate Public Member shall hold office for more than six (6) consecutive years or three (3) consecutive terms, whichever period is shorter. Mr. Barer has served two (2) two-year consecutive terms and Mr. Thomas has served one (1) two-year term.

Anticipating the completion of the Public Member and Alternate Public Member's two-year term, airport staff announced that the Camarillo Airport Authority was accepting applications to fill the Public Member and Alternate Public Member seats. The

announcement was made via the Department of Airports' social media platforms on November 3, 2025, with reminder notifications going out on November 21, 2025, and December 16, 2025. The deadline to apply for the Public Member and Alternate Public Member positions was December 19, 2025. Staff distributed all timely received applications to members of your Authority on December 23, 2025. Redacted applications from each applicant are attached as Exhibits #1 through #12. 

As centers for local jobs creation, an expansion of existing programming and services our airports offer could be an opportunity for an economic boon to the community at large. Furthermore, regional airports offer an exciting opportunity to be centers for climate resilience.

For these reasons and more I am applying for the position of Public Member, or Alternate Public Member, of the Airport Authority. I reside in Oxnard, though live in Supervisor Long's district. I believe the Public Member position offers an independent viewpoint, which I bring, while also offering to the position the public experience and policymaking know-how that is critical in this moment. I offer those qualifications with an especially keen ability to center judgements and recommendations based on research, analysis, and best practices.

I have devoted my life to public service in numerous ways over the decades. Where Air Travel is the Problem, Airports are the Solution

Harnessing Regional Airports As Centers for Climate Resilience

OVERVIEW

Modern consensus in the scientific community holds that climate change is a complicated issue involving numerous manmade and natural causes. Air travel has been well established as a manmade causative agent, with around 2.5% of CO₂ emissions being accounted for by aviation. Additionally, other non-CO₂ warming-related changes have been observed due to all aviation emissions and externalities in twice the amount as CO₂, making air travel a formidable threat to the planet. In fact, of all types of travel, flying causes the most damage.

And the problem air travel causes is only projected to worsen. Airlines have made significant steps in addressing emissions in recent years, though exponential growth amongst raw number of travelers in the air at any given time has outpaced emissions progress by around 6-to-1.

As with the issue of global climate change over all, it is therefore reasonable at this stage to suggest policymakers and public organizations turn to resiliency strategies, given the ongoing polarization of the subject, and the clear and certain refusal to prioritize climate impacts over convenience. And the good news for regional governments is that where air travel is the problem, airports are the solution.

This Policy Brief examines strategies regional airports may take to both improve their own internal climate resilience, while offering broader climate change action to the surrounding communities.

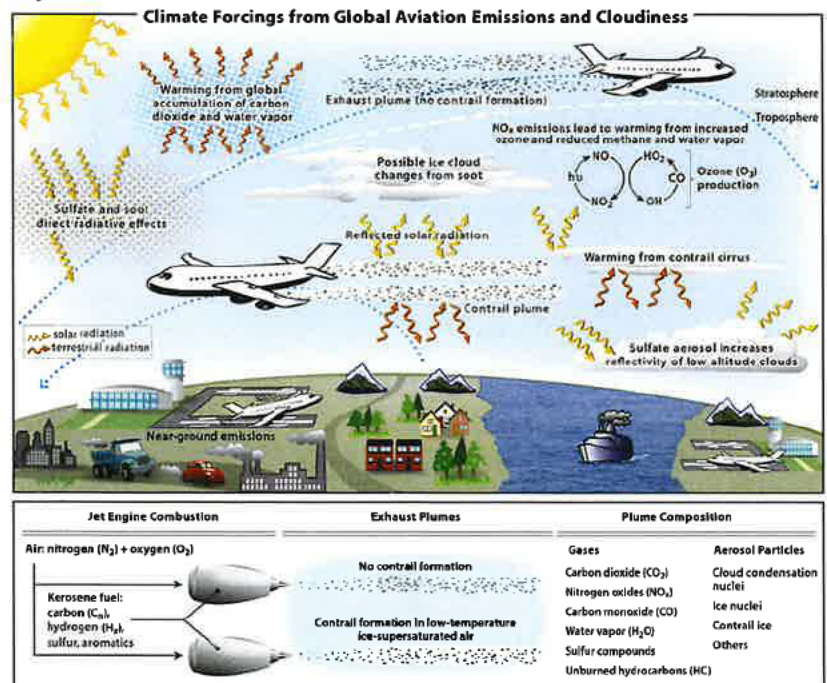

IMPACTS OF CLIMATE CHANGE ON AVIATION

Aviation does not only influence global climate change, it is also irrefutably impacted by it, including at regional airports where climate-fueled staffing challenges are especially prevalent.

STRATEGIES FOR CLIMATE RESILIENCE

HARDENED INFRASTRUCTURE

Regional airports are especially poised to implement climate hardening strategies, due to the limited cost of implementation at smaller airports. Such strategies include: converting ground equipment to electric or hybrid energy sourcing, rainwater collection and recycling, installation of solar for energy generation, and development of facilities and buildings on the property with smart technology in mind.

CARBON OFFSETTING

An emerging trend in airports and other ports of travel and global exchange (e.g. ports, transit center, etc.) is the implementation of certified carbon offsetting technology. These types of technologies convert, capture, or remove unavoidable fossil fuel emissions through various technologies and equipment designed to offset the carbon output of regional economic activity.

OPERATIONS EFFICIENCY

Airports and airlines should prioritize operational efficiency to develop climate resilience. This would include optimizing flight planning, which is especially critical for private air travel, and encouraging the use of SAFs, which blended with traditional fuel reduces emissions and preserves the life of the craft.

Climate resilience in an ever-changing landscape is not a one-time solution. Airports must dedicate time and resources to expand their knowledge base to understand and implement climate resilience strategies over time, and seek Airport Carbon Accreditation. One defining characteristic of global climate change is its unpredictability. Airports must therefore be malleable to new and emerging science, and appropriate funding as a part of regular operations accordingly.

Harnessing Regional Airports As Centers for Climate Resilience

In addition to becoming internally fortified against climate change for sustainability of operations, staffing, and long term revenue generation or economic output, regional airports have a unique opportunity to offer themselves as centers for climate resilience for the surrounding communities.

Regional airports often have sizable acreage of available land that is unused by runway tarmac and airport infrastructure, and therefore available for emergency operations in the event of a catastrophic climate-related event. Regional airports could also offer regions long-term water tanks and storage for wildfire response, as well as housing for emergency vehicles for rapid response to wildfire or flooding. Additionally, regional airports may develop planning and infrastructure to rapidly open shelter for humans and/or animals in the event of evacuations during a disaster scenario.

Regional airports are in the unique position, due to their accessibility to surrounding businesses and residents, to offer more sustainable transportation options for the community. For example, airports may install electric vehicle charging stations, available for public use. They may also work with area transit to ensure ample accessibility of public transit through the airport. Lastly, regional airports may develop "park-and-ride"-style parking structures available for public use - irrespective of whether the public is flying to or from the facility - to encourage regional carpooling.

When private businesses lease office spaces, hangars, and other facilities at regional airports, discounts and credits for implementing sustainability practices offer an economic incentive for other organizations to become partners in climate resilience and long term sustainability. Numerous studies have shown these types of credits improve economic activity in the region overall, while harnessing meaningful and long term investment in climate resilience.





Fiscal Impact:

Discussion:

The Department of Airports is continuing its work to bridge the gap between the Department, pilots, and the community with a heavy focus on building trust and nurturing relationships with all stakeholders of Camarillo Airport and Oxnard Airport.

For more than three years, Department of Airports' staff have focused heavily on community engagement through a variety of projects including the creation and implementation of Fly Friendly VC, two Part 150 Noise Compatibility Studies, the Airport Layout Plan for Camarillo Airport, the initiation of an Approach and Procedure Analysis for Camarillo Airport, and the establishment of a robust and transparent communication system that is designed with both neighbors and pilots in mind.

In addition, the Department of Airports began a series of feature stories highlighting the unsung heroes in local aviation in September 2023. This series puts a spotlight on those who tirelessly serve the community and who also help educate the community about a portion of local aviation that is often overlooked. The goal of the stories is to provide insight to the economic and philanthropic contributions made possible by the existence

of both Camarillo and Oxnard airports. Such contributions are often made under the radar and without knowledge to the general public.

The January 2026 story showcases the partnership between the Department of Airports and the Air Traffic Control Tower teams at both Oxnard and Camarillo airports and the bridges built to connect the community to both.

Subject: Receive and File Staff Update Regarding Video Surveillance and Access Control System Installation at Camarillo and Oxnard Airports

Recommendation:

Receive and file staff update regarding the installation status and planned activation of the new video surveillance and access control systems at Camarillo Airport (CMA) and Oxnard Airport (OXR).

Fiscal/Mandates Impact:

There are no additional fiscal impacts associated with this action. The project was completed within previously approved budgets and contracts, with a total project cost of approximately \$645,000.

Discussion:

The Department of Airports (Department) is providing an updated status report on the installation of the new video surveillance and access control systems at Camarillo and Oxnard Airports. This item was last presented to the Aviation Advisory Commission and Airport Authorities in June 2024, at which time system installation was still underway.

Installation of the physical infrastructure - including cameras, access control hardware, and supporting network components - has now been completed at both airports. The project has been in development for several years and experienced delays typical of large infrastructure efforts. Contributing factors included the COVID-19 pandemic, staff transitions, including the departure of the Deputy Director who initially led the project, standard government contracting and approval timelines, supply chain disruptions, and early efforts to negotiate individual agreements with tenants for camera placement. To avoid further delays, the Department ultimately moved forward with an alternate placement strategy that did not rely on tenant-specific negotiations.

The legacy surveillance and access control systems at both airports were more than 20 years old and relied on outdated network infrastructure and technology. The new system,

installed by Convergent Technologies, replaces that equipment with modern, high-resolution digital cameras, updated access control hardware, and a secure network backbone designed to support long-term reliability and future expansion.

While installation is complete, the system is not yet fully live. The Department is currently awaiting final pricing and configuration details from Convergent related to long-term video storage capacity. Once this item is finalized and implemented, the system is expected to be fully activated within approximately 30 to 60 days.

Overall, the completed system significantly enhances situational awareness, improves response capabilities, and provides an additional layer of security for the airports, tenants, and the County. It also strengthens the Department's ability to document conditions and activities should an incident occur, thereby reducing risk and improving accountability.

Department of Airports staff have been trained on system operation in preparation for full activation following completion of the storage component.

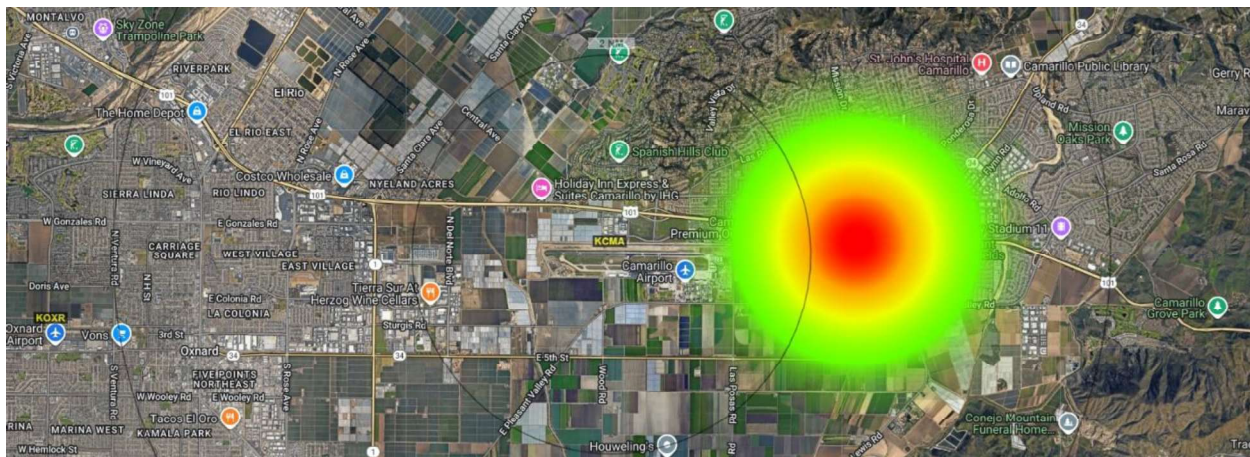

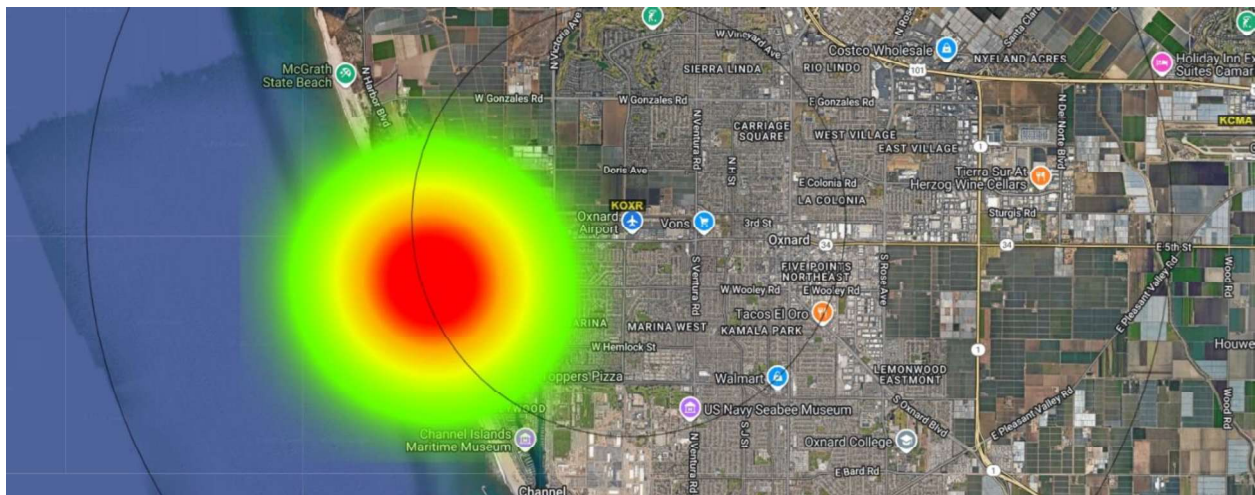

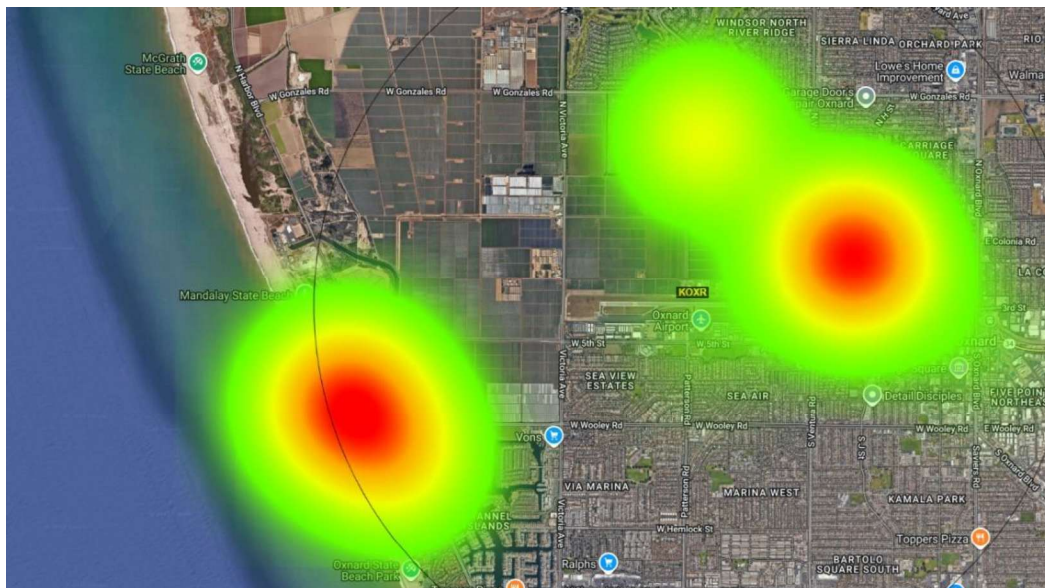

Camarillo residents care, work and 'invest in one another'

Mayor Kildee
addresses state of the city at airport museum

With planes around him a symbol of soaring high and far, Mayor Kevin Kildee delivered the 2025 State of the City address at the Camarillo Airport emphasizing themes of resilience, economic vitality and an ongoing commitment to public safety and sustainability.

Speaking in the Commemorative Air Force Museum Oct. 23 in an event co-hosted by the West Ventura County Business Alliance, Kildee opened by thanking the attendees and calling the museum a treasure, before praising the residents and City Council for their dedication, stating that the community is brought to life by "people who care, people who work, people who invest in one another."

Clothing store owner Kildee told the audience, "We stand on the shoulders of giants who came here first and set the pace." But the current council isn't too shabby either, he implied.

"We have an attorney. We have a nurse. We have a doctor. We have a (former) chief from the Ventura County Sheriff's Office. And we have a pants salesman. Now, is that diverse or what?."

"It is truly an honor and a privilege for me to serve as Camarillo's mayor," Kildee said.

The address came not long before the year anniversary of the Nov. 6, 2024, Mountain fire and Kildee emphasized "resilience" took on new meaning in its aftermath. He extended gratitude to the Ventura County Aviation Unit and the Camarillo Airport for serving as a critical staging area to fight the 20,000-acre fire, and thanked all who mobilized to activate emergency operations and deliver vital support to residents and businesses.

In summing up the city's response, Kildee said officials activated a special hotline, launched a dedicated recovery website and held community meetings with CalFire and Ventura County to keep residents informed.

Meanwhile, the Camarillo Public Library offered a safe place for residents to reconnect with Wi-Fi and essential services, and library staff created a gratitude display for responding agencies.

To embed a culture of resilience, Kildee said the city continues to implement its Sustainability Master Plan, making operations resilient to climate change, and reducing greenhouse emissions. Key efforts this year include: • Finalizing the Climate Action Plan: This will guide policies to protect the environment and reduce emissions, complementing the SMP. • Zero-emissions fleet transition: The city purchased 12 new Ford F-150 Lightning trucks, projected to save \$120,000 annually in fuel and maintenance costs. • A \$4 million state grant was secured for a future zero-emissions bus depot at the Metrolink station. The city aims to have nearly a third of its fleet be zero-emission, moving toward a 45% target by the end of 2026. A \$250,000 grant from the Clean Power Alliance is helping to cover the cost of additional zero-emission vehicles.

Other efforts along these lines include an LED lighting retrofit at the library to save energy and a mulch giveaway program with Agromin to divert organic waste from landfills.

Despite economic uncertainties, the mayor reported that Camarillo's financial outlook remains strong. The five-member City Council unanimously approved a \$159 million balanced budget for fiscal year 2025-26, focusing on public safety, economic security, affordable housing and technological advancements.

Camarillo maintains a triple-A bond rating from Standard and Poor's, with healthy reserves for fiscal flexibility.

The city's Economic Development Strategic Plan will be refreshed in 2026, maintaining a focus on growing and diversifying the economic base in sectors like advanced manufacturing and life sciences.

The draft of the Old Town Strategic Plan, a five-year action plan, is headed to the City Council before year's end to build Old Town's charm with better amenities.

The new OpenGov portal makes doing business easier, allowing applicants to handle permits, licenses, payments and inspections entirely online or at City Hall self-service kiosks.

Turning to some key economic data, Kildee said Camarillo has nearly 4,400 businesses, with 75% in commercial areas. The unemployment rate is 5%, which is better than the county (5.4%) and the state (6.1%).

The industrial base is solid with 11 million square feet of industrial space and more than 100 manufacturers. The industrial vacancy rate is 2.9%, well below the state's 7.3%. The office market has a vacancy rate of 11.7%, better than the state's 14.2%.

Kildee cited economic momentum in technology and manufacturing, noting: • HRL Laboratories expanded to strengthen the U.S. infrared hardware supply chain. • Sandvic's Battery Center of Excellence continues to grow as a global center for battery electric vehicle technology. • Magical's new manufacturing facility will enable a 300% increase in production capacity for aerospace and defense customers. Kildee also highlighted community-serving projects, including Central Plaza on Arneill Road welcoming a new Vons supermarket and gas station, with upgrades nearing completion. And site work has begun for a 160,000-square-foot Costco and gas station near Springville Drive and the Promenade.

Meanwhile, construction is progressing on a 1,000-capacity conference center and two hotels at the Promenade. New restaurants include Chick-fil-A, McKenna Coffee, 999 Pizza and 999 Tiki, with Texas Roadhouse and House of Bamboo Tiki Lounge coming soon.

Technology modernization is happening, with the city completing a five-year plan to guide how technology is used to better serve residents, reinforce public trust and strengthen cybersecurity. At the same time, city staff is creating an enterprise asset management system to track physical assets, digitizing records and enhancing technology for public safety.

An example of leading-edge technology, he added, are the council chambers, which underwent their first remodel since 1976, and boast new audio-visual and assistive listening systems.

Crimes against people and property remain flat this year with the Ventura County Sheriff's Office—the city's "police department"—targeting organized retail theft, holding outside perpetrators accountable.

calls, and new Opticom GPS devices at intersections allow first responders to preempt traffic signals during emergencies, enhancing safety and improving response times.

The city is working to ensure a diverse range of affordable housing choices, Kildee said, with nearly 1,000 homes under construction, serving all income categories, including Lennar's 159 single family homes at Springville (Cortona Community), expected to be completed in 2027; Williams Homes' 285 townhomes and 24 apartments at Palmira Camarillo Village, with units set aside for moderate and low-income buyers/residents, expected to be complete by the end of 2027; and Fairfield Residential's 385 rental apartments at Camino Ruiz, including 40 affordable units, which are expected to be completed next year.

The city also celebrated the groundbreaking and opening of the Vista Campanario Apartments, a joint effort that provides 100% affordable housing for low-income families, veterans, and disabled households. The city provided a \$4.9 million loan and donated the land for the 59-unit apartment complex, with eight for-sale townhomes under construction by Habitat for Humanity.

Kildee concluded by reiterating that Camarillo's best days are ahead, stressing that the city is resilient and will continue to move forward because, as the city's motto states, "Los personas son la ciudad—the people are the city."

I would like to clarify, and formally submit my comments from the November 13, 2025 Camarillo and Oxnard Airport Authority Meeting. I appreciate the efforts of your staff, particularly Erin Powers, to work with City of Oxnard staff to address questions regarding the Part 150 update process and response to City comment letters.

The City greatly values Ventura County Airport staff's willingness and openness to address staff concerns regarding community noise equivalent levels (CNEL). Airport Staff modified the Part 150 document to include a CNEL range of 60-65, which the City of Oxnard is supportive of. Staff's understanding is that the Ventura County Transportation Commission (VCTC), serving as the Ventura County Airport Land Use Commission (ALUC), will use the Ventura County Part 150 Noise Compatibility Planning Study to inform the future update to the Airport Comprehensive Land Use Plan (ACLUP). The City of Oxnard is in support of this Part 150 Noise Compatibility Planning Study with the 60-65 CNEL threshold as the basis for land use compatibility guidelines for Oxnard Airport and the ACLUP process.

Dear Charlie:

As we discussed last month, attached is the final report from consultant Geosyntec for the additional soils investigation, following the reporting from your consultant Trak Environmental last year.

As Erin noted in our phone call, there are options to consider for remediation (see page 6 of the report); at this point the County Department of Airports (“Airports”) is not in a position to pursue those costs, but they could be considered part of any capital expense requirement towards your project / lease requirements should you elect to move forward at this location.

At this time, and after you have had a chance to digest the information and seek input from your consultants, we request your determination whether you intend to move forward with your development - including the remediation - within 90 days by March 9, 2026.

For remediation, Airports would consider removal of the soils to an approved off-site location only; capping in place with a land use restriction and soil management plan would not be an approved resolution.

If you choose not to move forward with your project, Airports will re-issue a Request for Proposal for the site, advising the environmental clean-up requirements as part of the development requirements.

If you choose to move forward with remediation, you would have to sign the lease agreement within 60 days of your notice to us of your intention to proceed in order to begin your project, and we would extend the timeline for the completion of your improvements

from the original proposal (see Letter of Intent from January 2024) by 12 months to allow for the remediation process, giving you three years from lease commencement to complete your \$10 million investment/project. Rent at \$17,000 per month for the site would commence upon lease execution (we anticipate you will negotiate a rental arrangement with First Student to remain on a portion of the site until you commence remediation).

To summarize:

- Notify Airports no later than March 9, 2026 of Aspen's intent to undertake remediation or not;
- If Aspen declines remediation, Airports will re-issue RFP to develop the site to include required remediation by developer;
- If Aspen elects to undertake remediation, Aspen to execute new lease agreement within 60 days of notice to Airports to remediate.

Please let us know your decision no later than March 9, 2026. Thank you for your continued cooperation.
